


















Cross Hatching


Crosshatching is the drawing of **two layers of hatching** at **right-angles** to create a **mesh-like**


pattern.





















Hatching vs. Cross Hatching




goes in one direction whereas <u>cross</u> <u>hatching</u> is done through overlapping of lines.

Hatching has lines that








