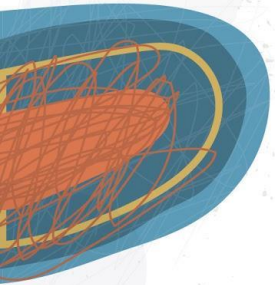
Ground Rules When Painting

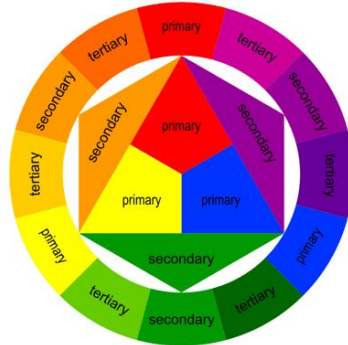
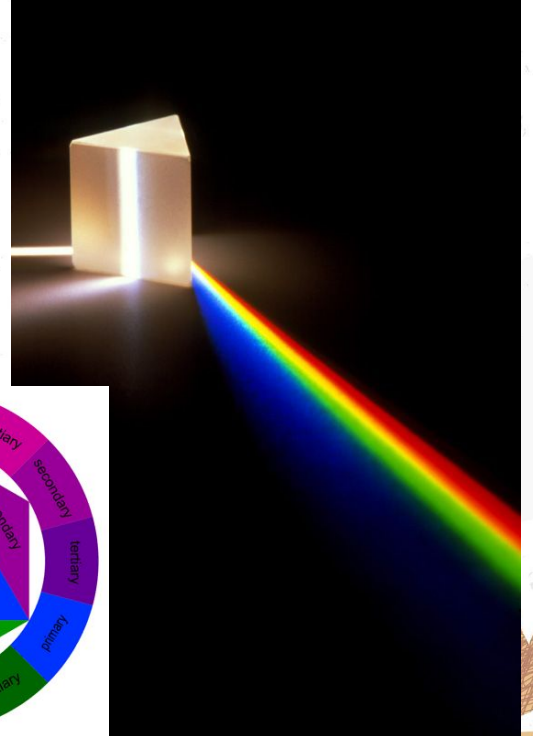

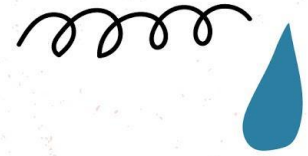


How Do We Understand Colours

1. Understanding colours is a complex process based on Isaac Newton's experiments with sunlight and prism: *white light was composed of seven visible colors.*
2. However colours can be understood better and easily with the help of what it is called a colour theory through the use of colour wheels.

What Are Colour Wheels?

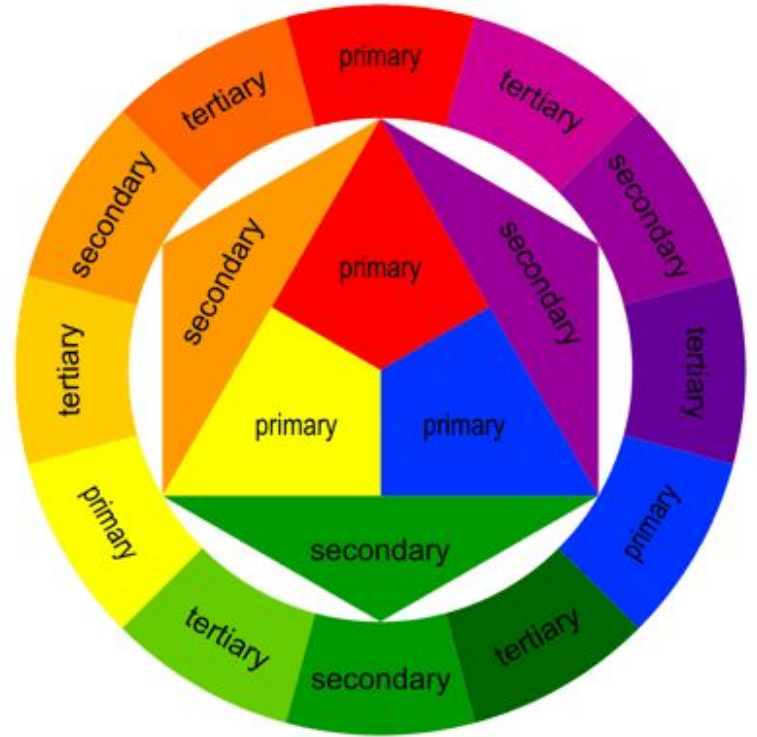
A colour wheel is an organization of colours to show relationships between or among them.

You can find 3 different categories in the colour wheel.

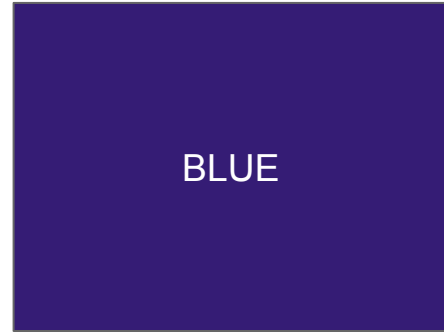
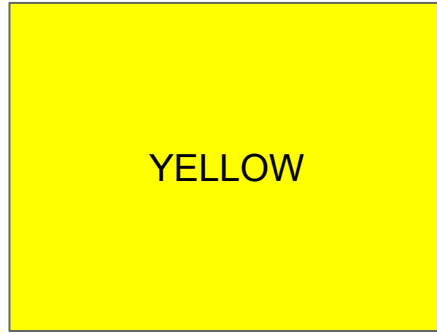
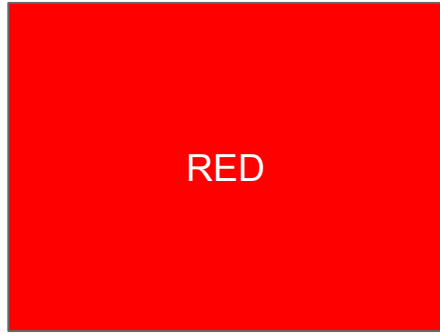

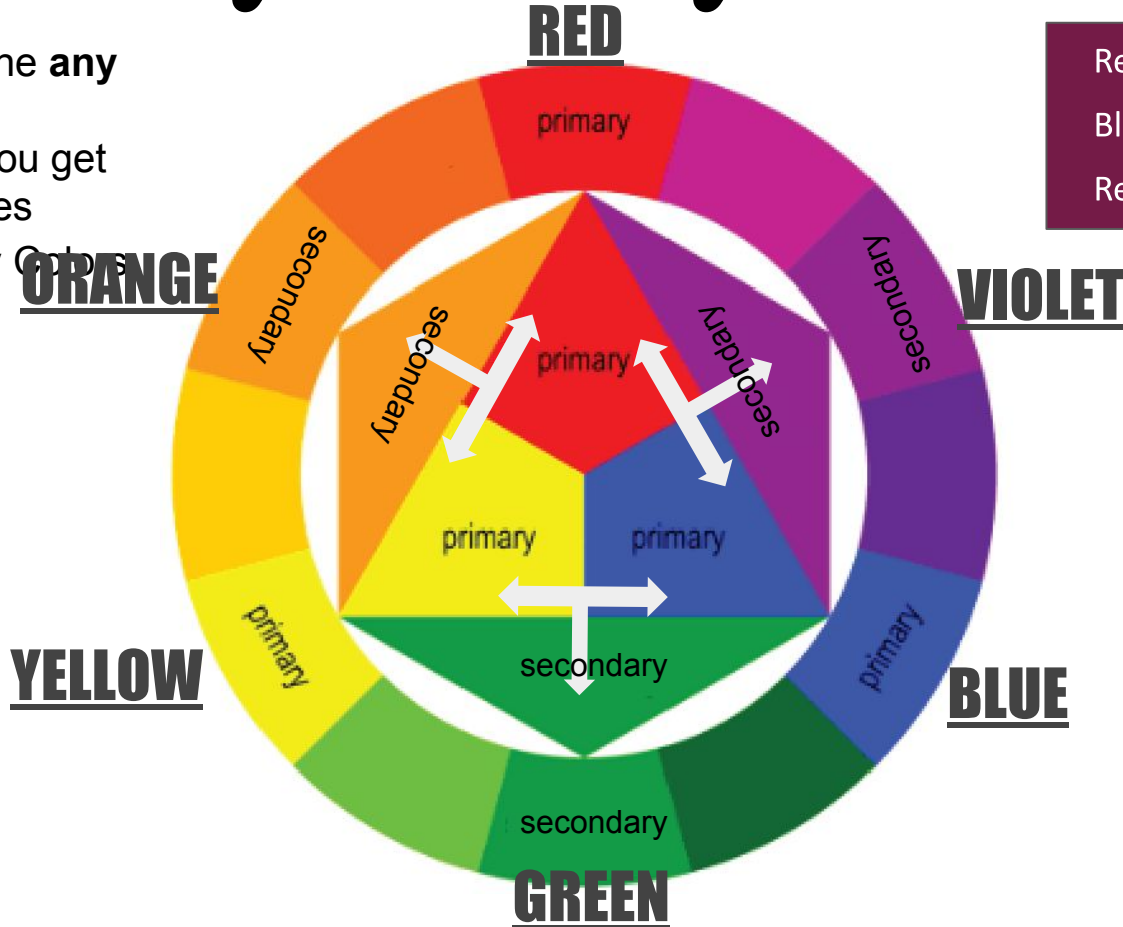


Colour Theory: **Primary Colours**

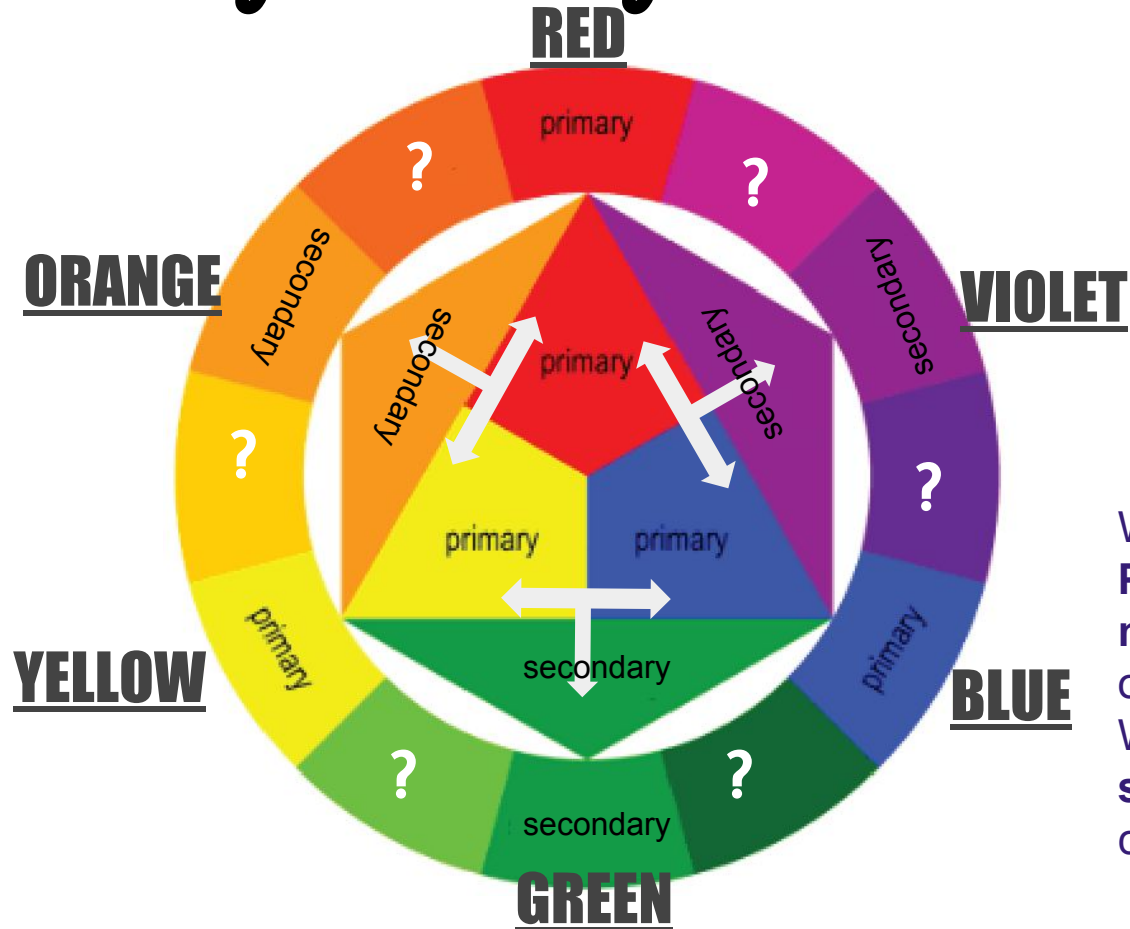


Colour Theory: Secondary Colours

When you combine **any two of the Pure Primary Hues**, you get three new mixtures called Secondary Colours.

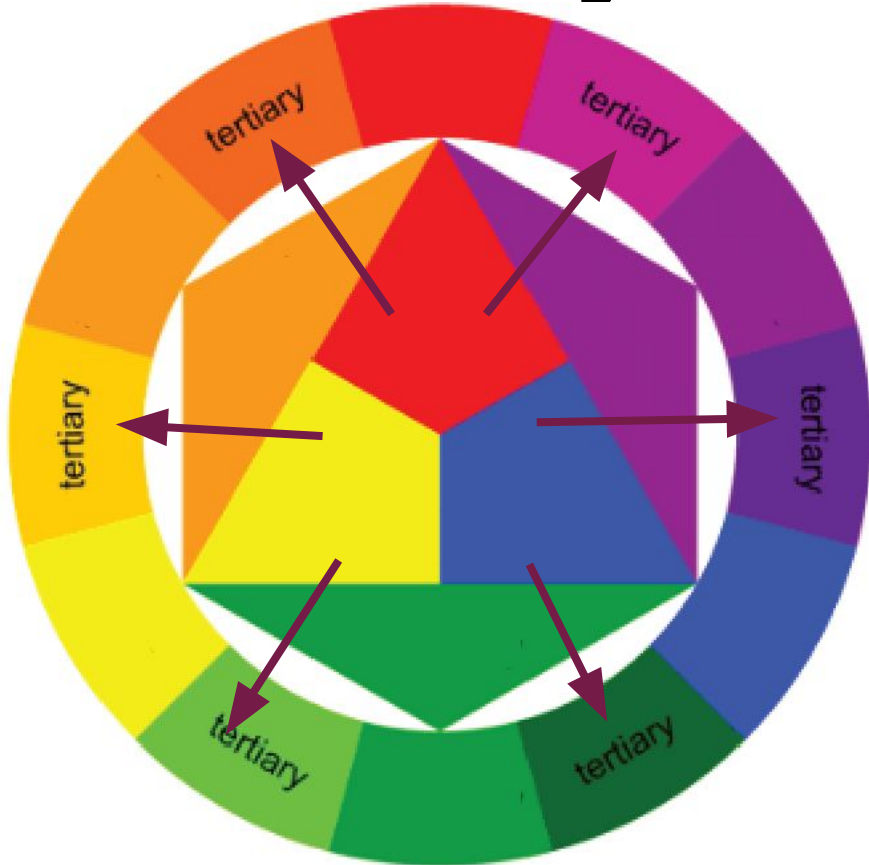


Colour Theory: Tertiary Colours



When you mix a **Primary** and its nearest **Secondary** on the Basic Color Wheel you create **six new mixtures** called Tertiary colors.

Colour Theory: Tertiary Colours



Yellow + Orange = YELLOW-ORANGE

Red + Orange = RED-ORANGE

Red + Violet = RED-VIOLET

Blue + Violet = BLUE-VIOLET

Blue + Green = BLUE-GREEN

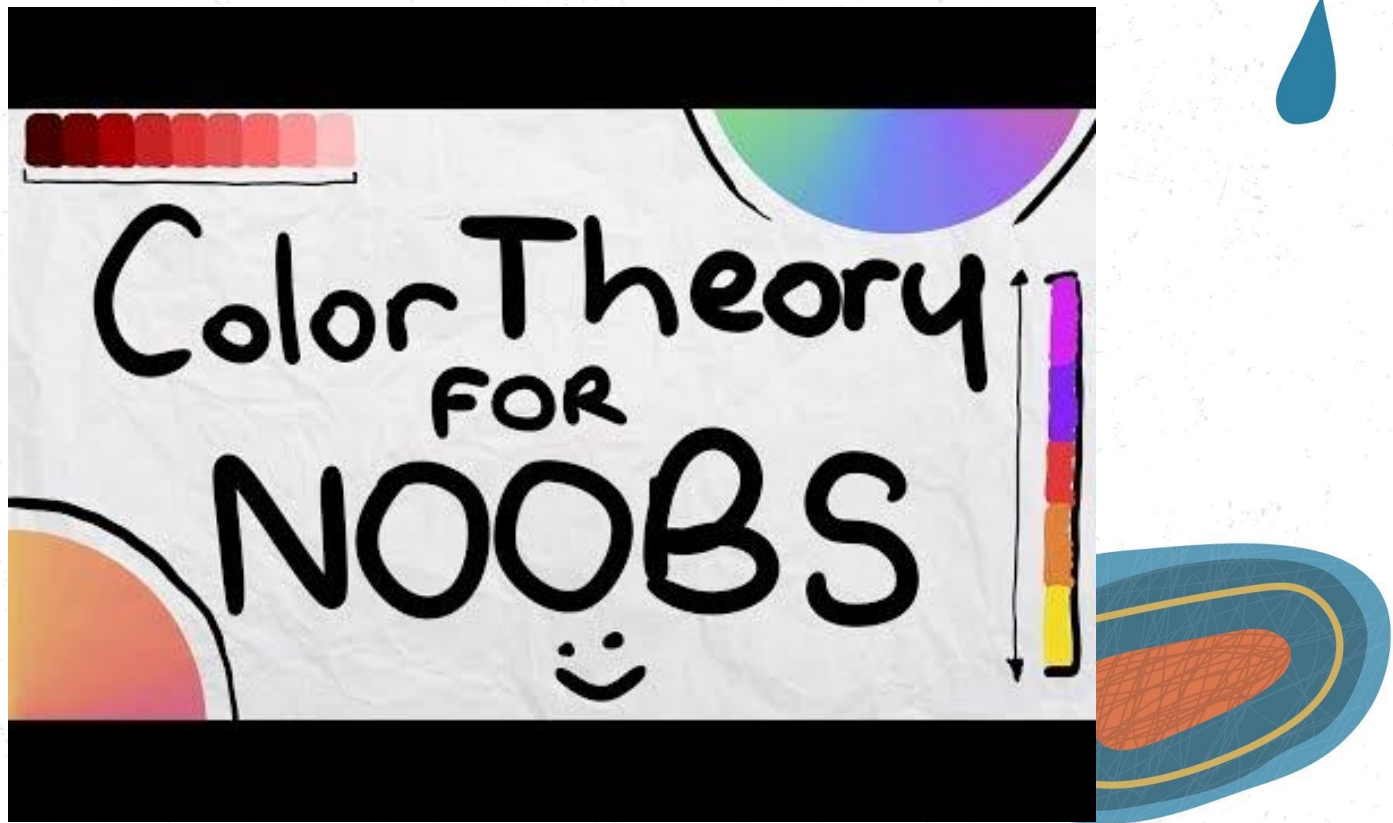
Yellow + Green = YELLOW-GREEN
