



Composition





Composition refers to the way parts of a scene are arranged in a camera frame to convey an intended message.

FOCAL POINT: the most important part of the photo

(1) Rule of Thirds

- Places the focal point at the intersection of a "tic-tac-toe" grid
- Shows:
 - the character of the story
 - her/his background/world







(2) Balance & symmetry

- Places character in the center of attention
- Gives the character power
- Causes tension







(3) Leading Lines

- Leading lines are actual lines (or sometimes imaginary ones) in a shot, that lead the eye to the focal point.
- Connect the character to other important characters or objects

(4) Depth of Field - blurred background

- Refers to how much of the photo is in sharp focus (vs. a blurred background)
- Creates distance between the character and her/his world
- Can be achieved on DSLR or in post-processing





(5) Depth of Field - deep focus

- Shows foreground, middleground, background sharply
- Tells a story between different characters/objects
- Various focal points









Photo Bingo Ensure your photo meets these standards

- Remember to turn on the **grid** on your phone camera

- **Lighting:** ensure your photo is well-lit, not too dark or too bright
